The new contract will go out to bid this coming Spring. The Board of Supervisors would appreciate resident feedback to better help determine what options to include or remove in the bid specifications in order to provide service most fitting to the wants and needs of our residents. #### **On-Lot Sewage Management Program**

<u>REMINDER</u>: Residents in Zone 1 (West of 225 to the western banks of the Susquehanna River) have until <u>December 31, 2024</u> to have their septic system pumped and inspected by a pumper/hauler who is registered with the Township. If your system needs repaired or replaced, there are grants and programs offering low interest rate loans to residents to assist. Please reach out to the Township office if you have concerns or questions about having your system pumped and inspected, or for more information on financial assistance mentioned above.

#### Common Questions Regarding the On-Lot Sewage Management Program

- \* I had my system pumped 2 years ago. Do I need to get pumped again? Yes. The owner of any property must have their system pumped and inspected within the time period specified in the Township's notification letter, unless the owner can provide the Township with a receipt or other written evidence showing that the tank has been pumped within the past one (1) year.
- \* How do I know who is an approved hauler/pumper? The list can be found on the Township website and at the bottom of this page.
- \* My hauler/pumper isn't on the list. How do they become an approved hauler/pumper. Simply have your hauler/pumper contact the Township office at 717-921-8128.
- \* Why does a hauler/pumper need to be approved by the Township? To protect homeowners and ensure legitimate, legally licensed/permitted and properly insured companies are being used.
- \* I heard about the new On-Lot Sewage Management Program but I didn't receive a letter. Do I need to send in my last pumping report? No. You will receive a letter when your zone is due for pumping. The Zones are as follows: Zone 1 West of 225 to the western banks of the Susquehanna River, Zone 2 Clarks Valley, Zone 3 Stoney Creek Valley, Zone 4 Fishing Creek Valley including Front Street, Roberts Valley Road and Greggs Road areas.

#### Septic System Knowledge

#### Why Maintain Your Septic System?

- \* It saves you money. Regular maintenance fees range from \$250 to \$500 versus the cost of repairing or replacing a septic system, which can be upwards of \$15,000.
- \* **Keeps you and your neighbors healthy.** A properly functioning septic system removes most pollutants from your household wastewater. A failing or malfunctioning system is unable to do such, causing bacteria, viruses and chemicals to contaminate groundwater. Contaminated groundwater can potentially cause acute gastrointestinal illness and hepatitis.
- \* **Protects the environment.** Continuing with contaminated groundwater, poorly or untreated household water poses dangers to drinking water and the environment. The bacteria, viruses and chemicals that are released are toxic to local waterways. These pollutants harm our local ecosystems, killing native plants and fish.

#### Ways to Prevent Malfunctions and Ensure Septic System Longevity

- \* **Protect it and inspect it.** Solids should be pumped out of your septic tank every 3-5 years, or when an inspection shows the tank is more than one-third filled with solids or scum. An inspector will also check that electrical float switches, pumps and mechanical components are all operating correctly.
- \* **Shield your field.** Direct rainwater run-off away from your septic system and drain field. Avoid planting trees or shrubs over or near your septic system. Keep anything heavier than your lawnmower off your drain field.
- \* **Think at the sink, and don't overload the commode.** Do not flush or rinse diapers, baby wipes (even ones marketed as "flushable"), cat litter, cigarettes, coffee grounds, fats, grease, solids, feminine hygiene products, prophylactic devices, household chemicals, gasoline, oil, pesticides, antifreeze, paint and high amounts of anti-bacterial soaps and detergents.
- \* **Don't strain your drain.** Stagger the use of water-based appliances. Don't do all your laundry in one day. Use high-efficiency plumbing fixtures and repair any leaks in your home.

#### Solid Waste & Recycling

#### History of Trash: How Did We Get Here?

The decision to become a single hauler community did not happen overnight. Prior to the adoption of Ordinance #53, Municipal Solid Waste and Recycling, it was up to each household to figure out how and where to dispose of their trash. This led to major issues with dumping/littering throughout the Township. Residents who wanted weekly trash pick up services had to seek out such on their own. Complaints surrounding various trash trucks being on our roads every day of the week and price gauging by haulers were frequent. A Township wide recycling program was first proposed in 1989 and officially began in 1991. The combined positive involvement with the recycling program and increased



interest from residents for a weekly trash pick up service by a single hauler, discussion by the Board began in 1994 regarding such. It took until 1998 for the Board to vote to adopt an Ordinance for Township wide trash collection.

#### The Bidding Process:

All municipalities must legally follow the **MAA (Municipality Authorities Act)** when seeking bids for a multitude of services based on price thresholds. Any purchase or contract over \$23,200 requires formal bidding. The formal bidding process from start to finish is as follows:

- ⇒ The Township composes bid specifications detailing what services they are seeking.
- ⇒ An Invitation to Bid is advertised in the local newspaper. This advertisement details what the Township is seeking bids for and provides a deadline for when sealed bids must be submitted by.
- ⇒ Sealed bids are opened at a public bid opening meeting.
- ⇒ The lowest responsible bidder is awarded the contract, or all bids must be rejected and the process begins again.



Things to Know: Bid specifications do not notate a price. When seeking bids, the Township's responsibility is to detail what services they are seeking. What the bidder submits to the Township in a sealed bid is what they say it will cost to provide the services being requested. The public bid opening meeting is when the Township opens the submitted bids and finds out what the cost will be. Negotiation of cost is prohibited under state procurement laws. The only options the Township has once bids are received and opened in front of the public is to either award the contract to the lowest responsible bidder or reject all bids.

In the next Solid Waste and Recycling bid specifications, the Township plans to provide as many different options as we can in order to receive bid responses from more haulers than previous year's bids. Things that may inevitably have to change in order to make this happen could include limiting or eliminating services that we currently have, the Township take over the responsibility of billing residents for trash and recycling services, and/or switching from loose trash bags to toters for automated trash pick up.

#### **Entry Guidelines**

#### An Invitation to Enter

As a youth organization in Pennsylvania, you are invited to enter the PSATS Youth Awards Contest sponsored by the Pennsylvania State Association of Township Supervisors. The contest is held each year to recognize youth groups who make valuable, lasting contributions to their communities.

If your group meets the eligibility requirements and would like to be considered for an award, please express your interest to your local board of township supervisors. The board, in turn, will help you submit your entry to the president of your respective county association of township officials for his/her signature.

#### **Purpose of Contest**

The contest is designed to recognize the valuable contributions made by youth groups involved in community projects that improve the quality of life in Pennsylvania's townships of the second class and encourage greater youth involvement in township government.

Youth groups are encouraged to work with their township government to identify and address specific needs within the community.

#### **Eligible Entrants**

All officially established youth groups, such as 4-H clubs, Scout troops, school and church groups, and civic service club youth organizations from elementary school through grade 12 are eligible for the contest.

#### From the Zoning Officer

Thinking about replacing or adding an addition, deck, shed, fence, pavilion, or patio to your property? Maybe repaving or enlarging your driveway or remodeling your home or garage? Make sure to get a permit from the Township, and if you are unsure whether or not your project requires a permit, always ask first. Depending on your project, different applications may be needed. Starting a project without the required permit(s) will result in additional costs. All applications are available on the Township website, <a href="https://www.middlepaxtontwp.org">www.middlepaxtontwp.org</a>, under Resources > Applications.

#### Permit Process:

- Submit a completed permit application and site plan to the Township office.
- The application is reviewed by the Zoning Officer. If additional information is needed or required, the Zoning Officer will contact you.
- Once approved, the applicant is contacted with the required fees due at pick up.

The Zoning Officer is in the Township office **Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday**. Call the Zoning Officer at **717-921-8128**, **ext. 107** to schedule an appointment. **Appointments are required** to ensure the Zoning Officer is available and can allot time to answer your questions and explain the process and requirements without interruption. **Walk-ins cannot always be accommodated.** 

# BE MINDFUL that the days of "build it now, beg forgiveness later" are no longer being tolerated!

Entities other than the Township, such as Dauphin County Conservation, PennDOT, Department of Environmental Protection, Dauphin County Tax Assessment, FEMA and PEMA are frequently in our municipality and make note of and question activity they see. Utility companies notify entities of work they are doing. PLEASE contact our Zoning Officer BEFORE you start any and all projects to confirm what permits you need, if any. Building without proper permits, and without meeting the proper criteria, will cost you even more money and time, and could potentially leave you in a position to remove your new structure entirely. Avoid the headache and hassle and simply reach out to our office, speak with the Zoning Officer and confirm the steps that need to be taken in order to properly fulfill your project desires without issue.

#### **Codes Enforcement and Compliance**

The Township's **Codes Enforcement Officer** is who handles enforcing Township ordinances and addressing complaints and violations. Residents are encouraged to report issues and concerns because we cannot be everywhere all the time. We ask that if you have a concern or issue, please **start by talking to the other party and try to resolve the matter amicably**. If this step is unsuccessful, please complete the following:

• Submit a complete and signed complaint form to the Township office. For a complaint to be acted upon, it MUST BE SUBMITTED IN WRITING. Specific details, such as address of concern, type of animal, breed of dog or cat, make/model of vehicle, picture/video evidence must be included in the complaint so that action taken can be specific and justified. Without specific details and information, enforcement cannot move forward. Complaint forms are available at the Township office and on the website, www.middlepaxtontwp.org. Please do not call and ask to verbally submit a complaint. VERBAL OR ANONYMOUS COMPLAINTS WILL NOT BE ADDRESSED. Names of complainants are not released. The Codes Official will review all properly filed complaints and determine the next steps.

If you file a complaint and the situation persists, please contact the Township office and let the Codes Enforcement Officer know. Too often it is assumed the Township isn't taking action when we are not aware that the situation has not been resolved.

#### Public Works Roadway Etiquette & Responsibilities

As autumn approaches and the leaves begin to fall, please do not blow or rake leaves, brush and/or any other yard waste into roadside swales or drainage easements. If you are unsure of whether or not you have a roadside swale or drainage easement on or near your property, contact the Township office and we can let you know.

Winter will be here before we know it. As always, this is your reminder to do your part to help keep roads, rights-of-way, sidewalks and fire hydrants clear of snow and ice this upcoming winter season. Middle Paxton Township has approximately forty (40) miles of roadway that gets maintained throughout the year. Our road crew works 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, 365 days a year when needed in order to keep our roadways and Township rights-of-way clear during inclement weather.

As a resident, during a snow emergency, you are responsible for removing items from Township rights-of-way, including but not limited to, cars, basketball hoops, trailers, campers and boats. This is necessary to ensure the safety of our road crew and to keep our equipment free of damage. If municipal personnel or property damage is incurred due to violations, you may be held liable. Please be patient and do not pass plow trucks for both the safety of our road crew, yourself and oncoming drivers.

#### IT IS UNLAWFUL TO BLOW OR PLOW SNOW, ICE, SLUSH OR OTHER MATTER ONTO TOWNSHIP ROADWAYS!

#### **PPL Guidance**



With severe weather comes downed trees. Sometimes these trees inadvertently take power lines down with them. Any trees on power lines must be directed to PPL. The Township cannot take care of these situations. PPL advises residents to call 1-800-DIAL-PPL (1-800-342-5775). Never approach downed power lines. Stay at least 10 feet away and keep kids and pets away. Always assume they are energized and carrying electricity.

#### **Generator Safety**

- Place generators in a dry, well-ventilated outdoor location.
- Generators emit carbon monoxide. Never operate a generator in your home, garage or any enclosed area.
- Use only safety-tested, heavy-duty cords designed for outdoor use.
- Turn off or disconnect all appliances and lights before you begin operating the portable generator.
- Remember to do maintenance between uses of generators: inspect filters, spark plugs, oil and fuel.

#### **Reflective Address Markers**



Ensure your house number is properly and visibly displayed with a reflective address marker. Reflective address markers help emergency services quickly locate your home in the event of an emergency. Markers can be ordered at the Township office. They are \$20.00 each, available in blue or green and can be made to hang either horizontally or vertically. Class fee is \$60 for 8 weeks or \$90 for 12 weeks.

What are the effects of inactivity? Older adults may be labelled a fall risk or have a reduced quality of life with an inability to age in place. Each class has an active warm-up, targeted exercises using arm and leg weights and ends with a cooldown. The result is to enhance overall functional fitness through improved strength, flexibility, and balance.

If you witness or pass an incident that you feel needs fire, state police and/or an ambulance,

#### **DO NOT CALL THE TOWNSHIP OFFICE!**

Dauphin County Emergency Management (911) will properly dispatch the services needed, as well as gather vital information from callers in the process.

Every second counts in an emergency. Do not waste time—ALWAYS call 911!

#### **PREPAREDNESS**

If an emergency happens, it is important to have a plan of action for you and your family. Creating an emergency contact list, planning for your family and having an emergency kit on hand are the most important things you can do to be prepared.

- 1. Meet with family members and talk about the dangers of different emergencies, such as floods, severe weather, nuclear attacks and flu pandemics.
- 2. Discuss how you and your family will respond to each possible emergency.
- 3. If your family is not together when an emergency happens, discuss ahead of time who will pick up the children and where you will meet if an evacuation is ordered. You should plan to meet as far away from the danger area as possible.
- 4. Discuss what to do in case the power is out or someone is hurt.
- 5. Draw a floor plan (map) of your home. List escape routes from each room.
- 6. Learn how to turn off the water, gas and electricity at main switches in your home. If for any reason you turn off natural gas service to your home, call your gas company to have it turned back on when the emergency is over. Do not try to restore service yourself.
- 7. Put emergency contact numbers near all telephones. Preprogram emergency numbers into phones with autodial features.
- 8. Teach children how and when to dial 9-1-1 to get help during an emergency.
- 9. Teach children how to make a telephone call to a trusted friend or relative if they are not with you during an emergency. Because it is often easier to call long distance numbers during an emergency than it is to call local numbers, one of your emergency contacts should be from outside your area.
- 10. Tell family members to turn on the radio, the weather station or television for emergency information.
- 11. Pick two meeting places—a place near your home and a place outside your neighborhood—in case you cannot return home after an emergency.

#### **CANDLE SAFETY**

Did you know the holiday season is the peak season for candle fires, with December and January being the peak months and Christmas being the peak day?

If you do burn candles, make sure that you...

- Use candle holders that are sturdy, and won't tip over easily.
- Put candle holders on a sturdy, uncluttered surface.
- Light candles carefully. Keep your hair and any loose clothing away from the flame.
- Don't burn a candle all the way down—put it out before it gets too close to the holder or container.
- Never use a candle if oxygen is used in the home.
- Have flashlights and battery-powered lighting ready to use during a power outage. Never use candles.



The National Suicide Prevention Lifeline can be reached by calling 9-8-8. Available 24/7, 988 calls are directed to trained counselors waiting to listen and support individuals with thoughts of suicide or self-harm, or to advise someone about how to intervene with a loved one experiencing a behavioral or mental health need. Counselors can make referrals for outpatient services, provide therapeutic interventions or activate a local mental health crisis team. An online chat feature is available at 988lifeline.org.
